

 - · West Bengal.









Legal background

- The DVC (Amendment) Bill, 2007 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 4th May, 2007.
- The Union Cabinet approved introduction of the DVC (Amendment) Bill 2011 on 16th June 2011 for the reconstitution of the DVC.





The DVC was established as a quasi-independent corporate body and its authority and planning activities are not restricted by existent State and District boundaries.







4 permanent members

Experts:

- 1.1. Water Supply
- 2. Irrigation
- 3. Electricity
 Generation,
 Transmission &
- Distribution

Government:

- 1. Central Government
- State of Jharkhand.
- 3. State of West Bengal



Mission: Authority and autonomy for the integrated development of the Damodar River Valley

- Promotion and operation of schemes for irrigation, water supply and drainage.
- Generation, transmission and distribution of electric power, both hydro-electric and thermal.
- Flood control in the Damodar river and its tributaries and the channels, for the improvement of flow conditions in the Hooghly river.
- Promotion and control of navigation in the Damodar river and its tributaries and channels.
- Promotion of afforestation and control of soil erosion in the Damodar Valley.









Financing of activities

- Electricity generation: capital expenditures (CAPEX) for power generation are shared equally between the three Governments (Central, Jharkhand, West Bengal).
- Irrigation: divided between the two State Governments (Jharkhand, West Bengal) in proportion to their water withdrawal for irrigation.
- Flood control: borne by the West Bengal Government, except for an annual contribution by the Central Government.
