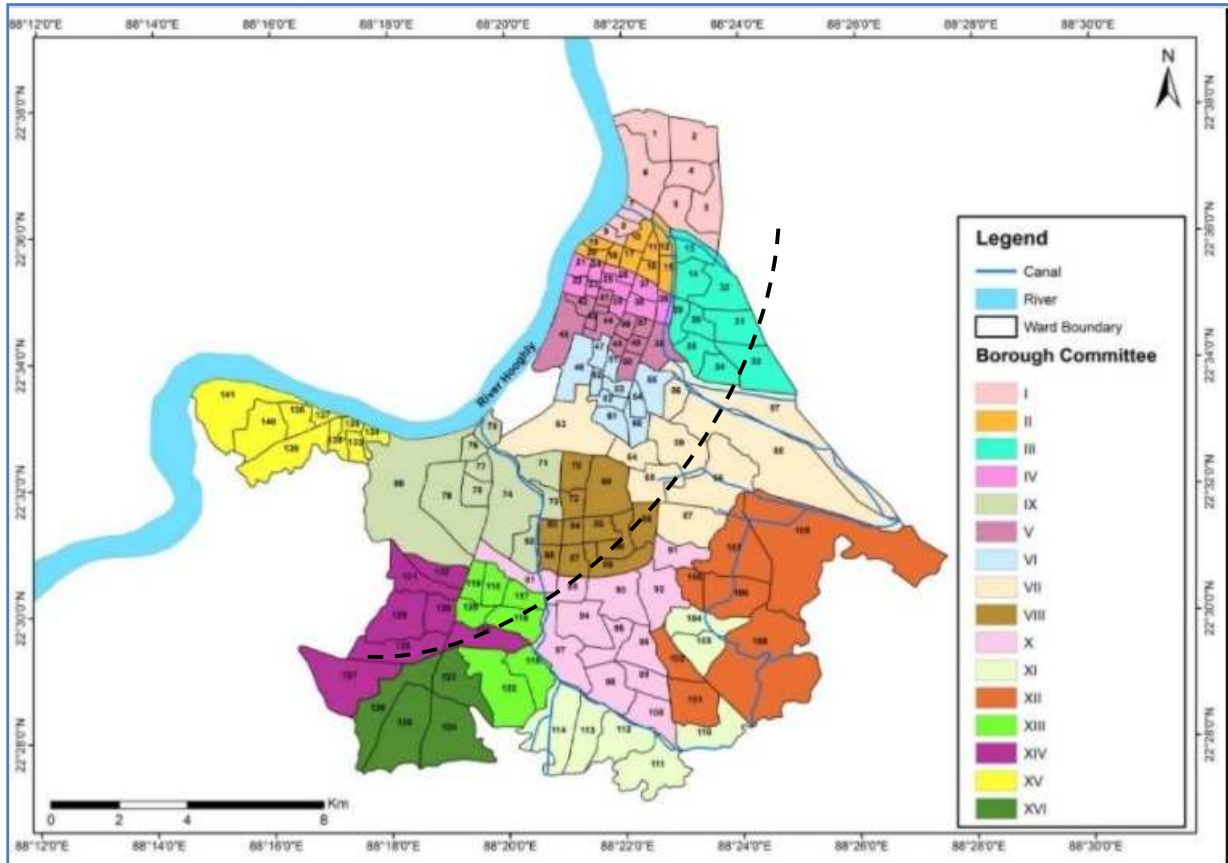

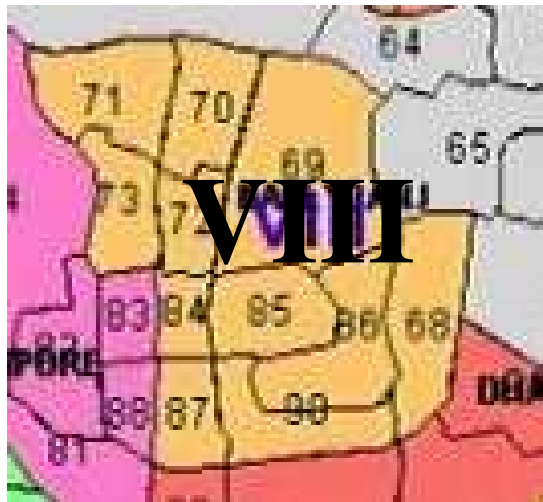

Historic Significance:

Bishop's College was founded by the first Anglican Bishop of Calcutta, Bishop Thomas Middleton on 15th December 1820 at Sibpur, on a site next to the Botanical Gardens by the side of Hoogly river. The original buildings still survive as part of the Bengal Engineering College. It was originally intended to serve as an Arts and Science College, as well as for the training of Indian Christians for the priesthood, and as catechists and



- teachers in Christian Colleges and Schools. The first students were received on March 9th 1824. The first Indian and the first student of the College to receive ordination was Christian David, a Tamil, working in Ceylon (Sri Lanka).
- Culture Significance:** Between 1832 and 1837 a number of Bengali Hindu converts joined the college, among whom were Mahesh Chandra Ghose, Krishna Mohan Banerjee and Madhu Sudham Seal.
- Social Significance:** With the introduction of the railway, it was felt that the college should be shifted to a suitable site in Calcutta and finally the present site at Beckbagan, Lower Circular Road (A J C Bose Road) was decided upon. The transfer of the Sibpur campus to the Government for an engineering college was signed on September 25th, 1879.
- Associational Significance:** Since 1918 Bishop's College became purely a Theological college, serving the whole Anglican province of India, Burma and Ceylon. Between 1918 and 1970 nearly 300 priests received their training in the college
- Local legends:** Bishop's College began as an Anglican college but with the formation of the Church of North India (CNI) on 29th Novemeber, 1970 become a College owned and managed by the CNI. However, it is a college that is ecumenical in its outlook and has teachers and students from many non-Roman Catholic Christian Traditions.

Historic Significance:

Bidhan Chandra Roy, the former Chief Minister of West Bengal and physician was impressed to see Deutsches Museum of Munich. He thought to set up a science museum and a planetarium in Calcutta. Roy requested to GD Birla for a help. Birla donated his residential house to the former prime minister of India Jawaharlal Nehru. The three storied Victorian style architectural building along with five bighas land of 'Birla Park', where they had lived for thirty five years



- Culture Significance:** The premise of Birla Industrial & Technological Museum, now 19A, Gurusaday Road, was known as 18, Ballygunge Store Road before 1919. Record shows that the Tagores purchased it from Mirza Abdul Karim in 1898. Meera Devi, the fourth of Rabindranath Tagore's five children, spent a large part of her childhood in this house. From Surendranath Tagore, G.D. Birla bought the property in 1919 and from henceforth came to be known as Birla Park. After the Birlas took over the property, there were major changes. The house used by the Tagores was pulled down and architects N. Guin & Co. were called upon to design the main building structure as we see today. It is a colonial adaptation of a mixture of various styles of European Art.
- Social Significance:** Starting with the taking over of the Birla Park in 1956 by the Govt. of India to the Museum's inauguration in 1959, the journey was quite eventful and challenging. Careful planning and painstaking efforts by the museum's planning committee that was headed by Dr. B C Roy himself and included a host of renowned scientists, educationists and industrialists ultimately resulted in the formation of India's first science museum under the ambit of the central government.
- Associational Significance:** From the very beginning BITM started conducting in-museum educational activities like Popular Lectures and Film Shows. Science Demonstration Lectures (SDL) for students became a feature of BITM from 1965. The same year also saw the launching of the first ever Mobile Science Exhibition (MSE) on wheels by BITM on the theme 'Our Familiar Electricity'. BITM started organizing 'Science Fair' for students from 1968 and the same year, the first Teachers' Training Programme (TTP) was launched.
- Local legends:** With the Birlas as the new owner, 19A, Gurusaday Road (Birla Park) continued to be a special address. Luminaries like C.R. Das, Arobindo Ghosh, Sister Nivedita, Rashbehari Ghosh, Anandamohan Sen, and other important foreign visitors like Kakuzo Okakura, Yokoyama, Tikan, Hishida and Katusta, all famous Japanese artists, frequented it at the time of Tagores. Again close association of G.D. Birla with nationalist leaders brought Mahatma Gandhi, Motilal Nehru, Lala Lajpat Rai, Pundit Madan Mohan Malaviya to Birla Park. It may be of some interest to know that it was here that Chiang Kai-Shek met Mahatma Gandhi.

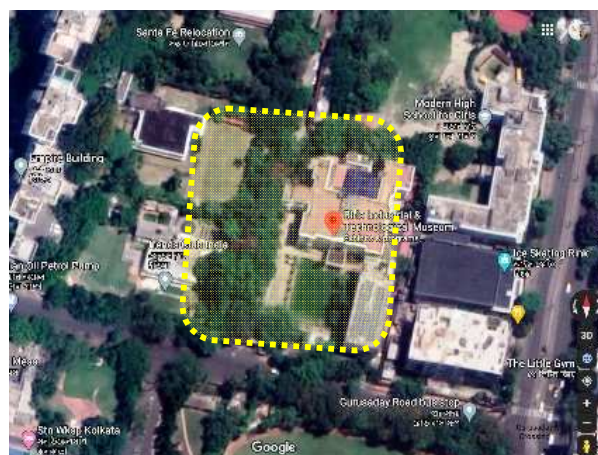

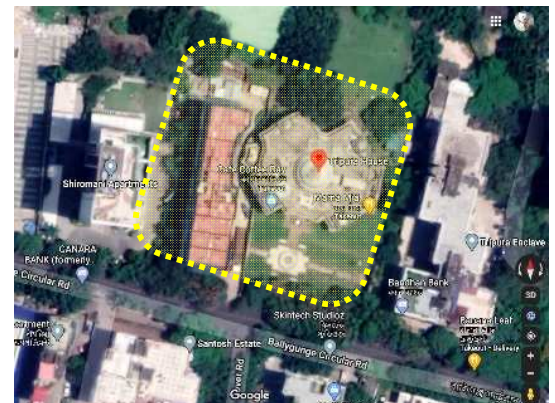

Mr Sambhunath Pandit was the first Indian to be appointed as Judge of Calcutta (Kolkata) High Court in 1863 and occupied that position till his death in 1867. It is said, he had two wives, one was Bengali and the second one a Kashmiri. We are decedents of the Kashmiri wife. Mr Pandit was born in Calcutta in 1820 and breathed his last in 1867.



In 1861 he joined Diwani Adalat as a Record Keeper. He qualified as a lawyer in 1848. Pointed out defects in legal system to the government and some laws were ammended with his help. He taught law in Presidency College and became Senior Government Counsel.

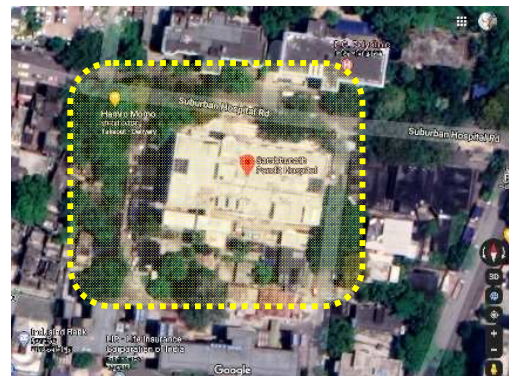

The house was built by Netaji Subhas Ch. Bose's father in 1909

Culture Significance:

Bose escaped from house arrest at Netaji Bhawan in 1940 and fled to Berlin. After that, he traveled to Japan-occupied Southeast Asia by submarine (German U-boat U-180 and Japanese submarine I-29), organized Indian National Army, and fought against British Raj with the Imperial Japanese Army.



**Social Significance:** Subhas Chandra Bose was an Indian nationalist whose defiant patriotism made him a hero in India, but whose attempt during World War II to rid India of British rule with the help of Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan left a troubled legacy. 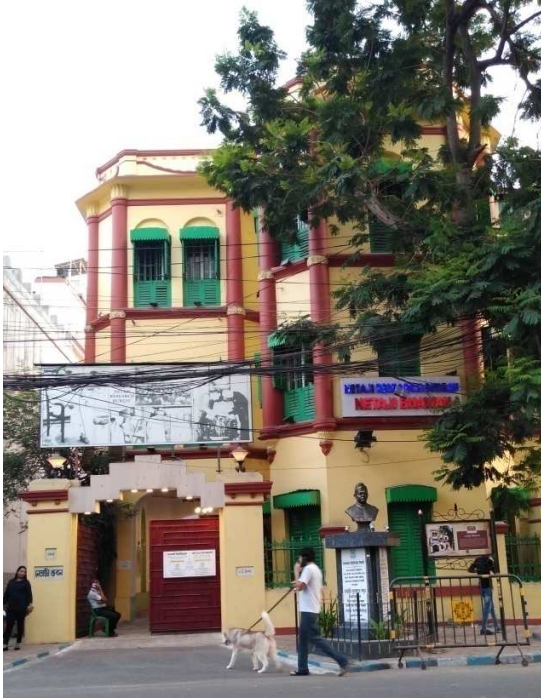

The foundation stone of the new Mandir was laid on the Maghotsava day of 1919 (11 th Magh 1325 B.E.). The suggestion of Sashi Bhushan Majumder to add a gallery in the hall was accepted and this was built at a cost of Rs. 2,500/-.

Culture Significance:

The consecration of the Mandir took place on 11th January 1920 and the prayers that day were offered by Satyendra Nath Tagore and Satish Chandra Chakraborty, the then Permanent Minister. The quarters for the Permanent Minister, a three storied building to the north of the mandir was built at the same time. The ground floor of the annexe to the east of



the mandir was built in 1952. Its second storey named after Satish Chandra Chakraborty was added in 1958.

Social Significance: Bhowanipore Sunday School was started on 2nd February 1902 in the then prayer hall of the Samaj, with 14 children. Hemlata Sarkar, daughter of Sivnath Shastri and Sunitibala Chaudhury were entrusted with the running of the school. Student's Weekly Service was started on 1st August 1909

Associational Significance: Rabindranath Tagore conducted the divine service on the morning of 17th Magh, 1915. During the Maghotsava festival that year, Maharani Suniti Devi of Coach Behar and the eldest daughter of Keshub Chandra Sen, conducted a Kathakata programme on 8th Magh.

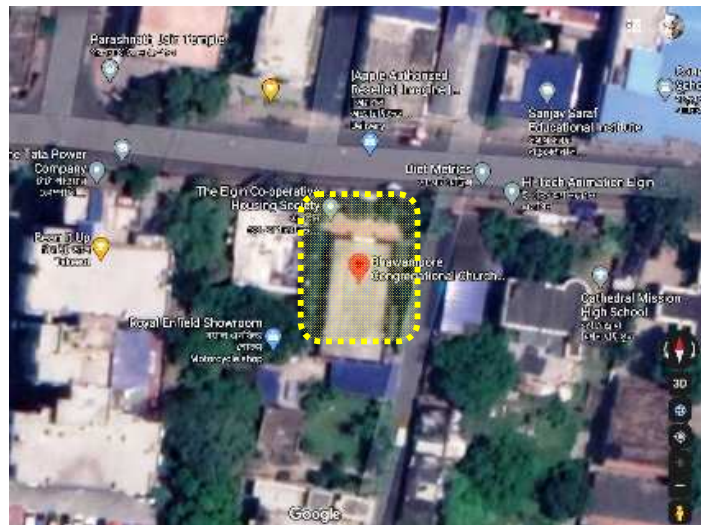

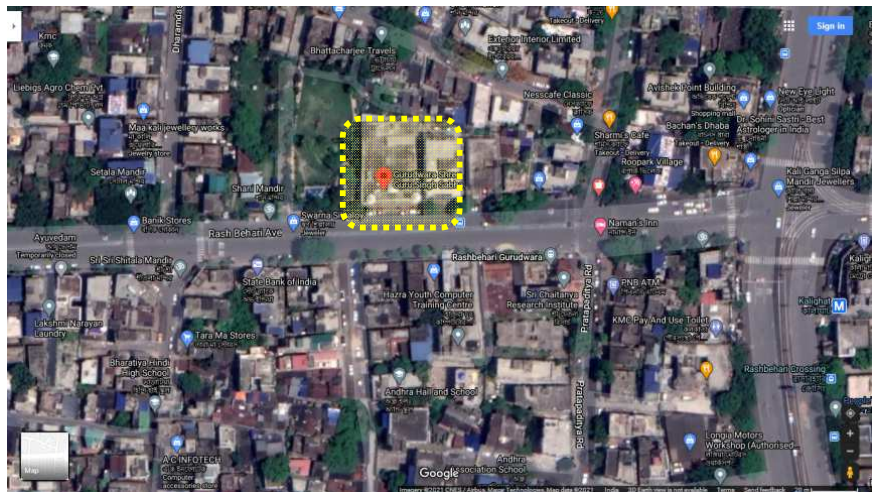

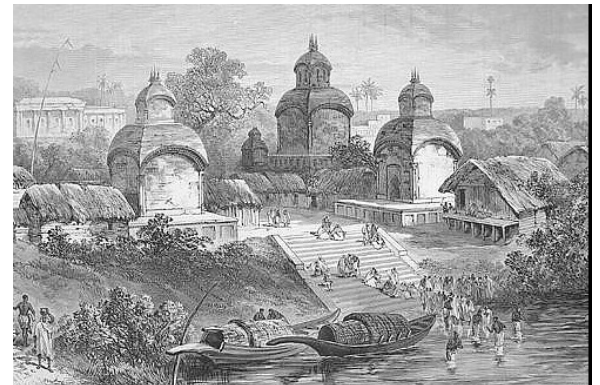

This is a Sati Pith The Kalighat Temple is ensconced in a web of myths. In 1809, Sabarna Roy Choudhury, the Zamindar (landowner) of the region, built the temple complex that stands today in the bustling south Kolkata neighbourhood.



- Culture Significance:** They offered 595 bighas of land to the Temple deity so that worship and service could be continued smoothly. It is believed by some scholars that the name Calcutta was derived from Kalighat. Historically, traders halted at Kalighat to pay patronage to the goddess. The temple was initially on the banks of Hooghly. The river over a period of time has moved away from the temple. The temple is now on the banks of a small canal called Adi Ganga, connecting to Hooghly. The present Dakshina Kali idol of touchstone was created in 1570 CE by two saints - Brahmananda Giri and Atmaram Giri based on the idol of Mata Bhuvaneshwari, the Kuladevi of Sabarna Roy Choudhury family. It was Padmabati Devi, the mother of Laksmikanta Roy Choudhury who discovered the fossils of Sati's finger in a lake called Kalikunda. This made Kalighat as one of the 51 Shakti Pithas. [
- Social Significance:** Every year, hundreds of thousands of devotees visit the Kalighat Kali Temple to offer their prayers
- Associational Significance:**
- Local legends:** Kalighat Temple has been referenced many times in the 15th and 17th-century Hindu religious scriptures. It might be because Raja Basanta Roy, the king of Jessore (presently in Bangladesh), had built a temple at the same location which was a layover on an important trade route. The same temple attained the status of a Shakti Peeth and was revamped more than two centuries ago. You will be fascinated to know that coins from the Gupta period (319-543 CE) have also been unearthed from the region. So, as you can see, the history of the temple has been mired in folklores and controversies that have only contributed to the enigma of the temple.

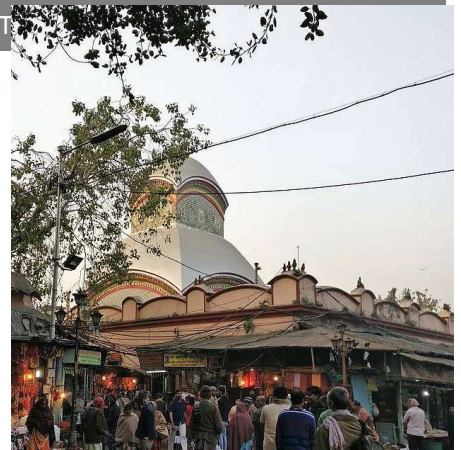

**Culture Significance:** Hastings, the second Greek Orthodox Church came up in Amratala area and was opened to public in 1781. In 1924, during the reign of King Geroge V, Greeks shifted their church for the second time close to Kalighat. The foundation stone of the church was laid on November 3, 1924 and the first prayer was held on November 19, 1925.

**Social Significance:** With the Greeks moving out, the church became non-functional and was finally locked down in 1972. And then, in 1991, it was reopened on the initiative of the Greek embassy. At the time, Sister Nectaria, who was posted in South Korea, was asked to come and take care of the church. Father Ignatios was in charge of the church. He also established the Philanthropic Society of the Orthodox Church.

**Associational Significance:** Today the members of the Greek Orthodox Church in Calcutta (Kolkata) consists mainly of Bengali converted Christians and Sunday services are held regularly in Bengali.

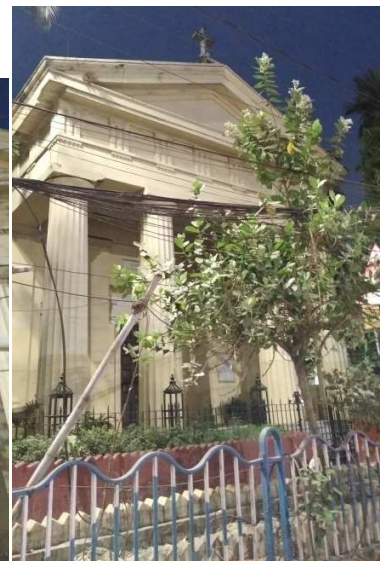

In 1707, the first hospital in Calcutta was built in the premises of the Old Fort at Gerstein Place. This hospital, initially built for the Europeans, was then known as Presidency Hospital. PG Hospital was honoured to be the first Post Graduate Medical Institute in Eastern India in 1957. From 16th January 1957, the hospital came to be known as The Institute of Post Graduate Medical Education & Research (IPGMER). Lord Minto, the Viceroy of India at the time, had wished to invite Rajen Mookerjee to dine at the Bengal Club and, when the discriminatory policy was exposed, a decision was taken to form a club with a membership policy not dictated by race.



**Associational Significance:** Ironically, despite its origins as a reaction to discrimination, the club has historically restricted membership to men. It was only from 2007 that the club started admitting women members.

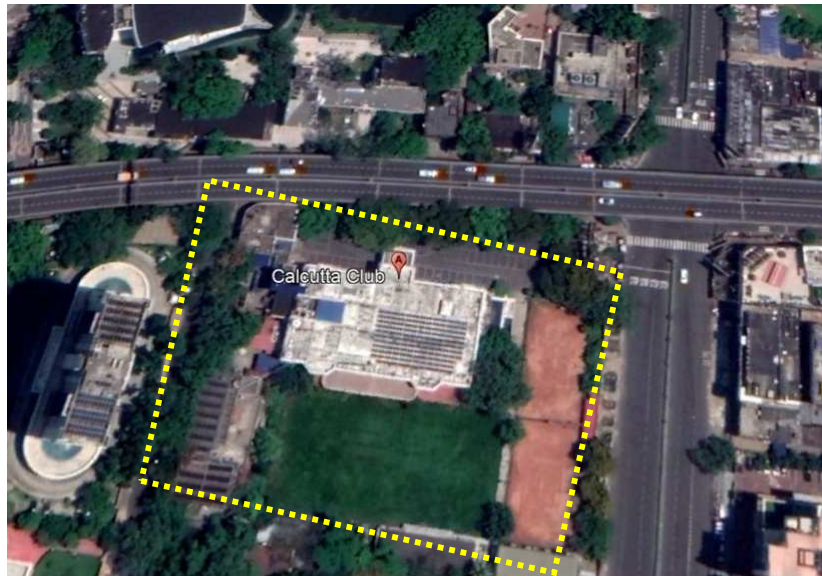

The Bhawanipur War Cemetery has been in use from the year 1864. Although, the cemetery has been officially recognised in the year 1907, and the burials of the First World War began here. Earlier the graves were in denominational plots throughout the cemetery, war graves and civilian graves were all unorganised making it difficult to identify. It was in the year 1954, when the church authorities decided to clear certain plots and the war graves were segregated. These graves now form a separate section containing the graves of the two World Wars. It contains 95 Commonwealth burials of the First World War and 617 numbers Second World War burials.

The corners of each temple is accentuated with coffered walls. The BhukailashRajbari lying on the other side of the road has an entrance that leads to a large courtyard lined with several temples. On the left is the huge dancing hall whose roof has long collapsed. The complex also houses two small cannons. On the right is the <i>ShriShriPatitaPaboniDurgaMandir</i> housing the family deity of the Ghosal Family.

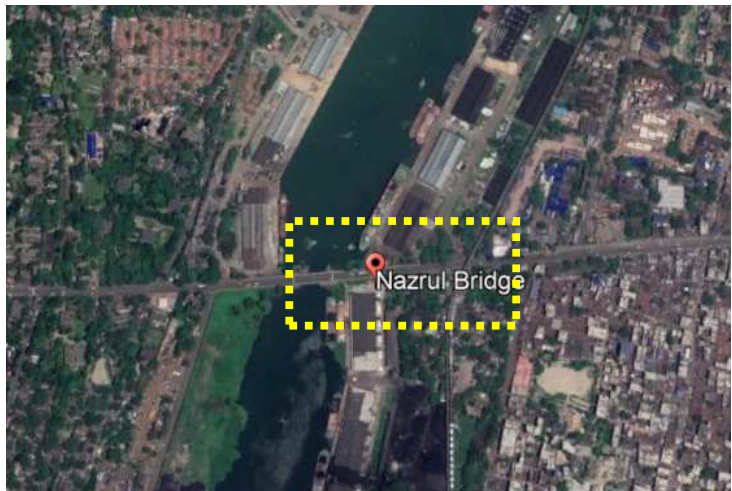

The opening of the Mumbai-Thane line in 1853 marked the beginning of railways in India. In 1887, the Bengal Nagpur Railway (BNR) was formed for extending the Nagpur Chhattisgarh Line. The management of the BNR was taken by the Government of India in the year 1944. In 1952 BNR was merged with East Indian Railway Company to form Eastern Railway. In 1955, South Eastern Railway (SER) was formed out of Eastern Railway. The head quarter was constructed in 1907 at a cost of rupees seven lakh.

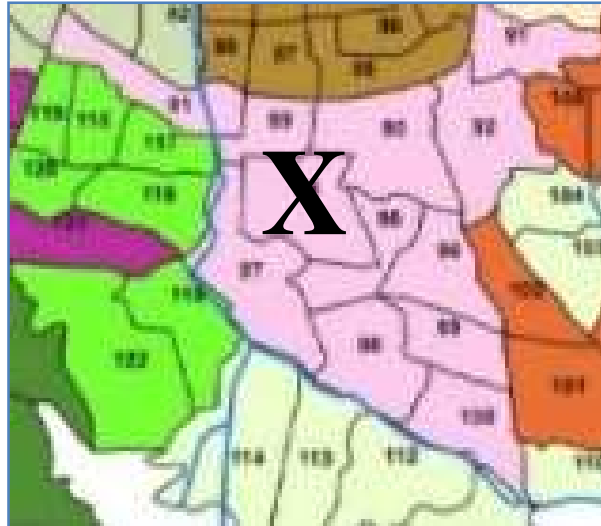

**Local legends:** Drainage tunnels around the complex still visible indicate that the central square was flooded at high tide by the Adi Ganga, today's Tolly Canal, which flows right beside the temple.

**8. Architectural Description**

**Architectural Style:** *Aath-chala* style of Bengal temple architecture.

**Site & Surrounding:** Dense urban settlements with surrounding vegetation. Adi Ganga passes adjacent to the site.

**Plan:** The temple complex has two parts. One is a group of 12 *aatchala Shiva* temples, surrounding a large central courtyard and all having a square shaped plan. The other is another *aatchala Madanmohan* temple preceded by a rectangular *Natmandir*.

**Façade:** All the temple temples have a common typology of having a cusped arched entrance, having accent corners and eight roofs (*Aathchala*) atop which is crowned with *akalasha* above. However the *Natmandir* is like a hypostyle hall used for worship. All the temples rest on a high plinth approached by a flight of steps.

**Decorative Feature:** Described above.

**Building material and:** Brick, lime plaster.

**Construction techniques** Brick masonry.

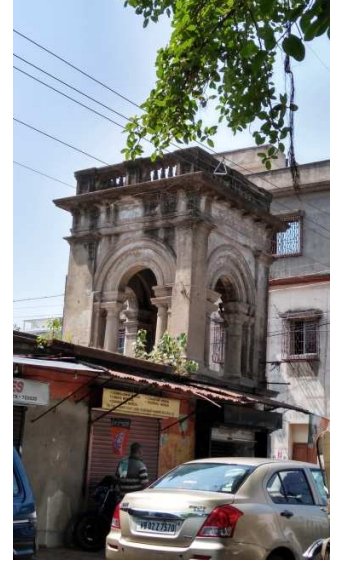

The Chota Ras Bari temple complex of the Tollygunge was constructed by Pyarilal Das and Manimohan Das and was completed in April 1847. The Mondals of Bawalibuilt spectacular temples and mansions in Bawali. The Adi Ganga served as a pilgrim route and several other temples were built along its banks, namely, the Radhanath Temple, BoroRas Bari (major house) and Choto Ras Bari (minor house).The pilgrims had a brief stop at the Choto Ras Bari and made their way to inside the elaborate temple complex.

The pinnacles of the temples are corbelled and have arched entrances supported over circular columns.

The Shahi Masjid was built around 1856-57 by Nawab Wajid Ali Shah and was meant for his personal use. Iron Gate Road gets its name from an actual iron gate at the entrance to the Nawab's estate. It is said that before the foundations of the mosque could be laid, Wajid Ali Shah made a proclamation, inviting anyone who had not missed even one of the five daily prayers to lay the foundation. The King laid the foundation himself, when no one appeared even after a month.

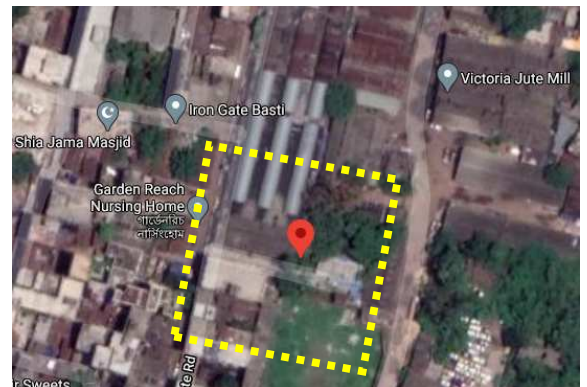
