




To develop sustainable and viable economic development for the Ganga basin, Namami Gange mission took the lead by integrating people's participation for Ganga Rejuvenation through the visionary concept of Arth Ganga.

One of the major objectives of this programme is to **strengthen capacity and public awareness** and promote multi-sectoral coordination. NMCG emphasises on the conservation of River Ganga through building a public opinion by stakeholders' engagement. To facilitate new research initiatives, capacity building, information collation and knowledge dissemination through different platforms and at multiple places, a knowledge-based institution- Ganga Knowledge Centre (GKC) was established for rejuvenation of River Ganga.

Ever heard of NMCG?.....

Registered as a society of MoEF&CC (Ministry of External Affairs and Climate Change) on 12th August, 2011. Its area of operation is Ganga River Basin. Four defining visions were best suited to restore the wholesomeness of River Ganga.



Mission of the programme were identified as follows-




How did we shift towards Basin Based Approach?
